7. School Development Plan

The plan is regularly monitored and revised to take account of progress made and any changes to curriculum requirements.

The School Development Plan for the 2024-2025 academic year was approved by Governors. The targets set included short, medium, and long-term aims, and were regularly reviewed by the Governing Body.

Following our Estyn Inspection Report published in January 2024, our School Development Plan targets were reviewed and amended in line with Estyn's recommendations, which were:

- 1) Improve self-evaluation, monitoring and improvement planning to ensure that it focuses on the aspects most in need of improvement
- 2) Improve the quality of teaching and assessment to ensure that lessons meet the needs of all learners
- 3) Ensure that teachers plan opportunities for pupils to improve and refine their writing skills to make the progress they are capable of

9. Sporting Aims and Achievements

The school takes part in numerous sporting activities throughout the year and children show a keen interest in physical activity. We participate in events that are organised by the LA, RCT Sport and the cluster.

We offer dance, netball, rugby and multi sports after school sporting clubs.

10. Healthy Eating

We have a number of policy documents that state, as a school, we promote healthy eating and drinking in the school. Children are encouraged to drink water throughout the day. They are encouraged to bring fruit to school for a mid-morning snack. Children are offered a nutritional breakfast and school lunch. Healthy packed lunch leaflets are also distributed to parents periodically.

All Foundation Learning pupils (Nursery-Year 2) have the opportunity to have milk daily. While at school, children drink water regularly using drinking bottles. "Design to Smile" promotes keeping teeth healthy in Foundation Learning classes.
